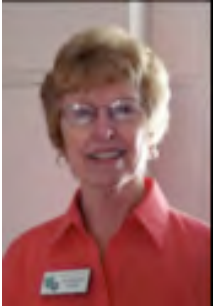

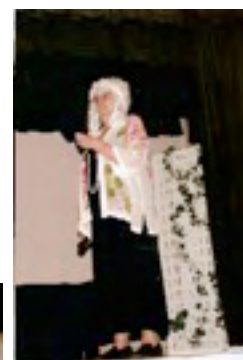

Conservation - Joy Marcon

This is an important message for all of us who live alone concerning the conservation of our own health and safety. The Torrance Fire Dept. is sponsoring a promotion called **Vial of Life**. First of all they supply a vial about the size of a small jelly jar with a lid. This clear plastic vial will contain a document listing all of your medications and their appropriate dosages, recent or previous major surgeries, all medical conditions, the name of your doctor and hospital as well as vital stats and other medical information. This document will also disclose your emergency contact.

Once this form is completed by you, it is rolled up and placed into the vial. A small label entitled **Vial of Life** is attached to the outside of the fridge. The vial is then displayed in a prominent place inside your fridge and attached to a shelf with a rubber band. If necessary, Fire Fighters, Paramedics, and Emergency Medical Technicians will see the sticker that directs them to look inside the fridge. They will then be able to give you the best of care by reviewing all of your personal medical information. Call the Torrance Fire Dept. at (310) 781-7000 to obtain the vial, the sticker, and the form.

One of the best ways to save the planet is to eliminate waste before it is created. The suggestions listed below will allow us to contribute to this worthwhile endeavor.

- *Buy reusable rather than disposable products.
- *Bring your own bags for purchases from department stores and markets.
- *Buy in bulk whenever possible.
- *Avoid individually-wrapped or single serving products.
- *Choose products with refillable or reusable containers.
- *Buy fresh produce without packaging.
- *Donate items to charities that are no longer of use.
- *Compost yard waste and kitchen scraps.
- *Send e-mail instead of paper memos.
- *Use the back of discarded paper for scratch paper.

if we all begin to practice them,
our combined efforts will make a difference.**
